ACCORDING TO GILLETT-SWAN (2017) "HIGHER EDUCATION PROVIDERS ARE BECOMING INCREASINGLY AWARE OF THE DIVERSITY OF THEIR CURRENT AND POTENTIAL LEARNERS AND ARE MOVING TO PROVIDE A RANGE OF OPTIONS FOR THEIR ENGAGEMENT".



THIS IS GENERALLY BROKEN DOWN INTO GENDER, AGE, AND ETHNICITY AS PRIMARY DIVERSITY CHARACTERISTICS (STAVREDES, 2011).



SECONDARY CHARACTERISTICS WOULD BE ENROLLMENT STATUS (ONLINE VS. CAMPUS), WORK STATUS, AND MARTIAL STATUS (STAVREDES, 2011).

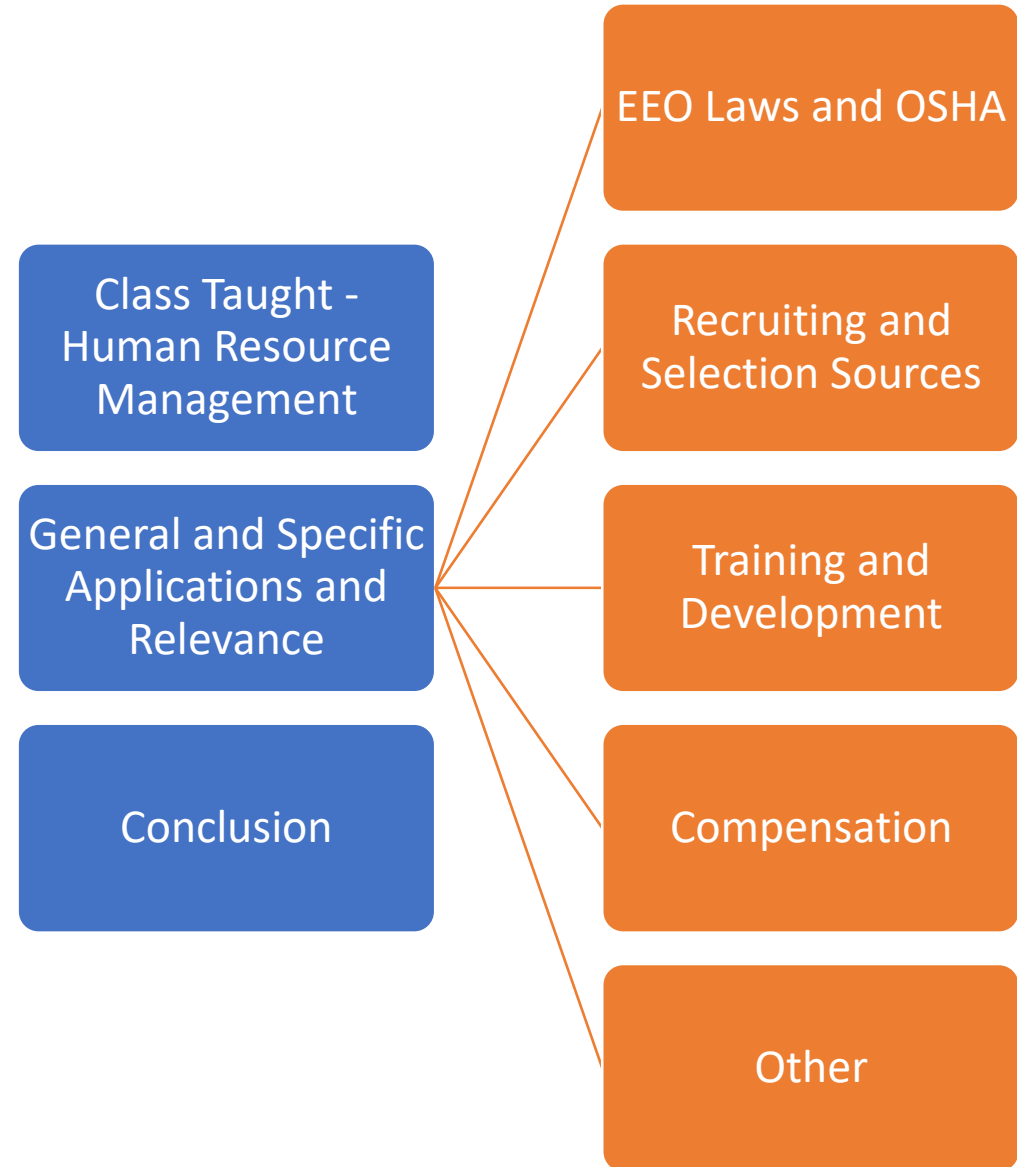
The Business Professional – New Ways of Seeing & Understanding



Benefits/Challenges of IPE

- Integration with other legal knowledge
- New ways of seeing as a foundation/proposition
- Better understanding as information more relatable
- No one-size-fit- all approach possible
- Can encourage and discourage out of the box thinking
- Providing bitesize information could distort
- Interest not shown in other disciplines or areas

IPE in Online Learning

- Benefits of Interprofessional Education in Healthcare
 - Patient centered care
 - Care team collaboration
 - Increased understanding and perspective of care team roles
 - Increased patient satisfaction
 - Increased positive health outcomes
 - Reduced re-admission rates
 - Positive communication



IPE in Online Learning

- Challenges of Interprofessional Education in Healthcare
 - Best practices are unclear
 - Designing effective group projects to promote collaboration
 - Designing effective assessment tools
 - Incorporation of practical learning
 - Competency development
