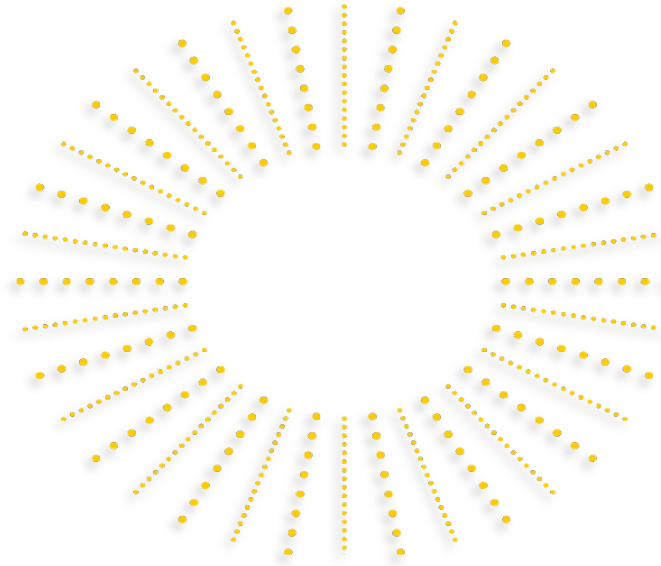

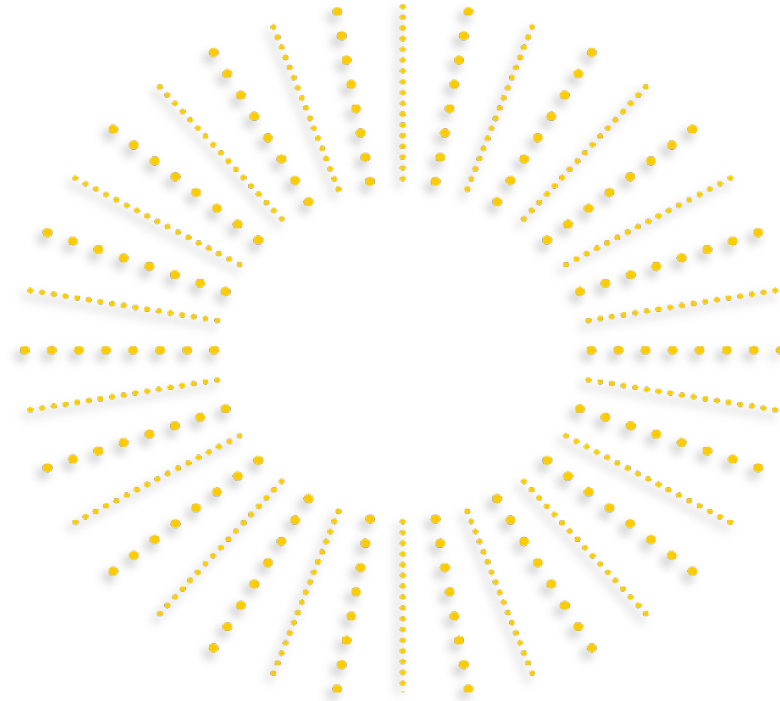

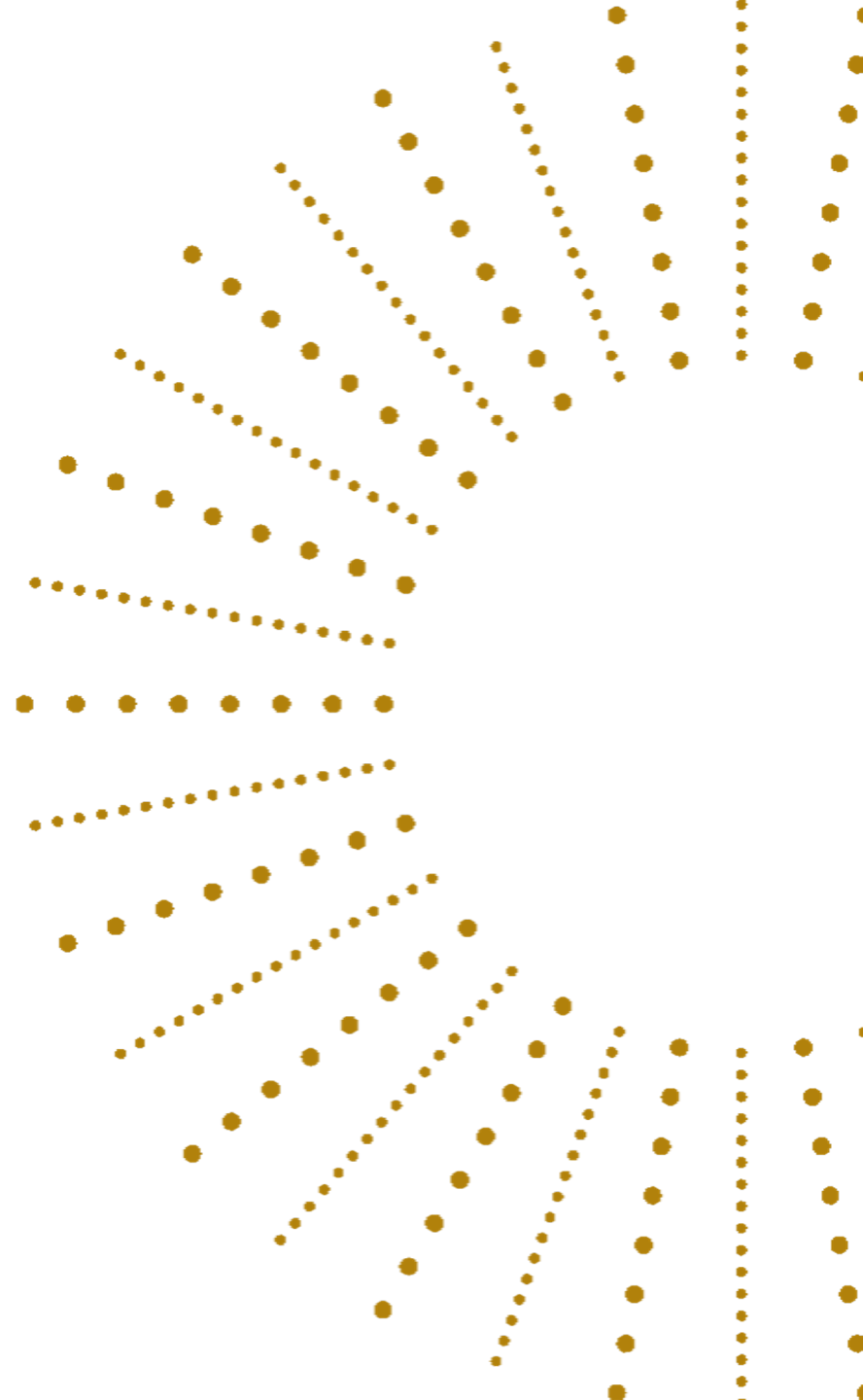
Presentation Overview

Overview of the Professional Studies Degrees

- The Bachelor of Science in Professional Studies (BSPr) is an excellent choice if learners have transfer credits, open course credit, or experiential learning credit (including military).
- The Associate of Science in Professional Studies (ASPr) is a smart choice to begin your college degree journey. To enroll, learners must have completed at least one college course.

Overview of PANEls

The **P**roject-based **A**ssessment of **N**ew **L**earning (PANEl) is a competency-based assessment for undergraduate credit at Purdue Global. The PANEl allows you to document learning acquired from open educational resources, video courses, textbooks, or other sources to demonstrate your competency of given course outcomes. The contents of your PANEl may include essays, presentations, problem analysis, video/audio submissions, etc.
